The arts are a powerful teaching tool. The **Arts in Education** programs of the Acadiana Center for the Arts (AcA) provide arts experiences to students as well as tools to teachers for integrating the arts into education.

These programs are interdisciplinary learning adventures designed to connect real-life experiences with academic instruction through a broad range of quality arts events and workshops.

With over 40 years of partnership with the Lafayette Parish School System, the mission of the AcA is to foster art and culture in Acadiana.

Founded in 1975, AcA has developed as a major force in public education and community development in South Louisiana.

AcA supports the creation of new works of art, exhibits, festivals, performances, and public art across the eight-parish region of Acadiana. AcA aims to bring equitable access to the arts and supports fair compensation of artists. On average, AcA serves over 300,000 people annually, provides fair compensation to 2,700 artists, and brings arts experiences to more than 43,500 young people across Acadiana.

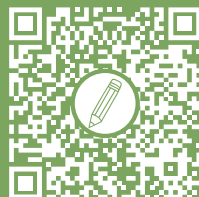

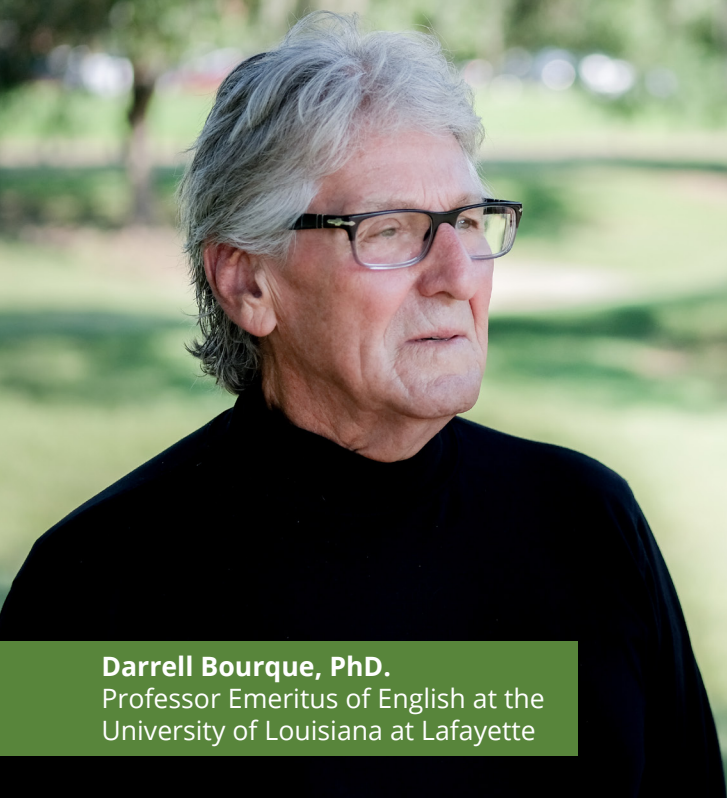
CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE TEACHING THROUGH COLLAGE

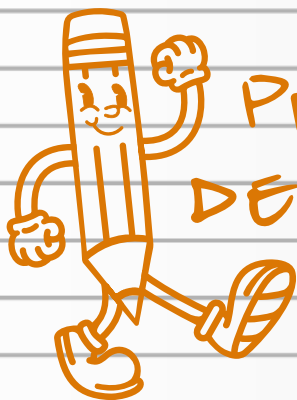

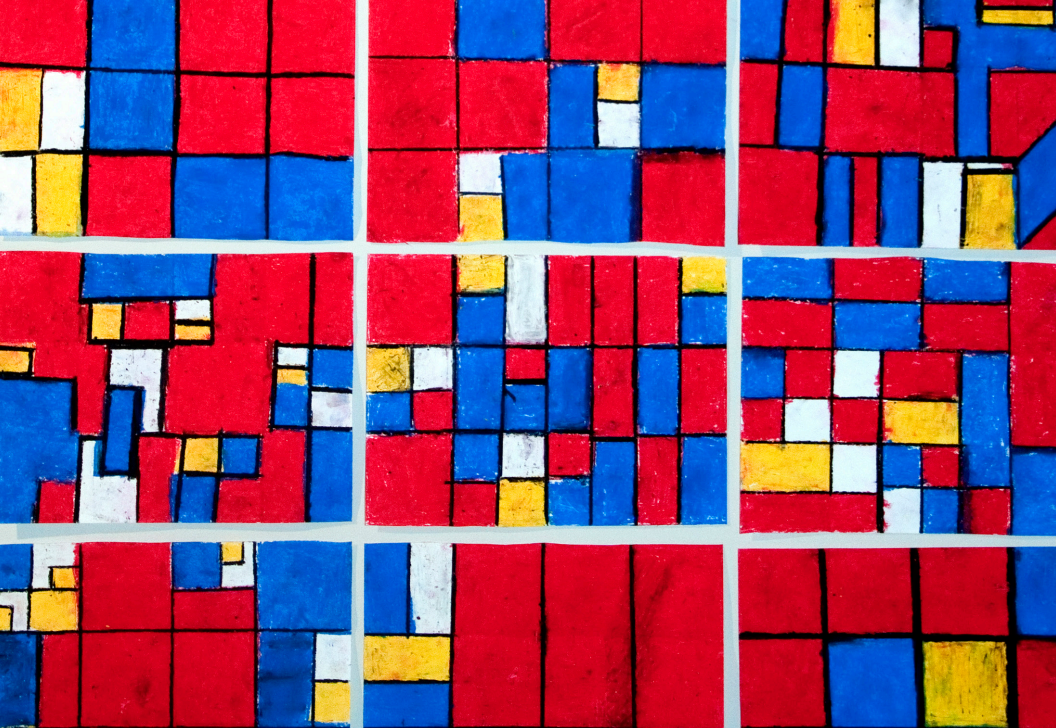

MAIN GALLERY EXHIBITIONS

MARTIN PAYTON: *Legacy of Form*

September 9, 2023 - January 13, 2024

Martin Payton (b.1948, New Orleans) comes from a family of accomplished New Orleanian musicians and holds at the core of his artistic practice the styles of improvisation and African Polyrhythms embedded in New Orleans Jazz. Payton's sculptures resemble silhouettes suggestive of traditional African forms with a minimalist, modern personality. Martin Payton served as Professor of Art at Xavier University, New Orleans, and Southern University, Baton Rouge before retiring in 2011. Through his long career at Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs), Payton has been a mentor to thousands of currently practicing artists from the American South.

IN MEDIA RES: *How one Story Becomes Another*

February 10, 2024 - May 11, 2024

This exhibition will explore methods of viewing, responding and creating with the artistic guidance of 2007 Louisiana poet laureate, Darrell Bourque. In this exhibition viewers will encounter artworks of which Bourque has engaged during his writing processes. They are artworks that have inspired thought, stories and poetry. Visitors will see artworks paired with writing and invites to engage and respond with varying prompts. Some of the notable artists to be featured will be artworks by Megan Barra, Bill Gingles, John Hathorn and Russell Whiting.



Other AcA Exhibits

In addition to larger exhibitions, AcA presents exhibitions of emerging artists, students, and fine crafts artists year-round, working with a community of partners.

SIDE GALLERY

KELLI FORET RICHARD: *DRAWN TO GROW*

August 12 – October 14, 2023

Drawn to Grow is a project rooted in Food Sovereignty, Decentralization, and Regenerative Agriculture Practices, aimed at engaging the public with a call to action. These 57 drawings intend to offer a prayer and meditation asking for the healing of our planet as well as to stimulate public discourse and awareness around these important topics.

RALPH SCHEXNAYDRE

September 9, 2023 – January 13, 2024

This exhibit features a selection of artworks from local artist Ralph Schexnaydre utilizing a variety of specialized photography and photo-emulsion techniques like lumen-prints, cyanotypes & traditional Black & White photography to provide a new way of looking at natural shapes and the complexity of the visual natural world.

SARA HARDIN

February 10 – March 9, 2024

Sara Hardin makes complex oil paintings created from direct observation of familiar architectural interiors and private garden spaces in her new home of New Orleans, Louisiana. She writes, "Through my work, I present a visual narrative where architectural structures symbolize the conscious mind, while the abundant growth of untamed plant life represents the hidden recesses of the unconscious."

COCA-COLA STUDIO

MARY ATTWOOD & ANGE RIEHL: *IMPROVISATIONAL EXPLORATION*

September 9 – October 14, 2023

This exhibition showcases two approaches to improvising with found materials to make fabric-based collages and assembled objects, “assemblage.”

OPEN STUDIO ACADIANA

November 11 – December 9, 2023

Open Studio Acadiana is a unique decentralized event across Louisiana’s Acadiana celebrating the area’s artists and craftspeople. Since 2016, Open Studio Acadiana has been managed by Louisiana Crafts Guild with leadership by Burnell Lemoine. Today, Open Studio Acadiana delivers this annual community event each November, the weekend before Thanksgiving, while indexing the region’s artists, studios, galleries, and museums for the public to explore 365 days a year online.

KRVS 60TH ANNIVERSARY EXHIBITION

Paintings, drawings and poems by these two ladies will grace our AcA Café at the close of 2023.

CODOFIL EXHIBITION
