

Dedicated to celebrating childhood, nurturing cultural exchanges and fostering literacy through her music and books, Johnette has performed all over the world.


CAJUN EDITION

Metaphors Be With You: A Guide to Seeing the World Through the Eyes of Poetry with Allan Wolf

Booklist says, "Allan Wolf makes reading and writing poetry cool." Hailing from Asheville, NC Wolf performs poetry from memory, mixing theatre, music, juggling, and lots of audience participation. He is also the author of many picture books, poetry collections, and young adult novels celebrating his love of research, history, science, and poetry. In this lively talk, Allan will include the story of how he wrote on his bedroom walls as a child and how a simple penny launched his writing practice in seventh grade. As a special treat, Wolf will share the process of researching the history of the Lake Peigneur Texaco Oil drilling disaster in Iberia Parish, Louisiana and how he turned that research into a graphic novel.



CONNECT *TMM Project*

This new inspirational program taps into humanity by focusing on trauma and mental health issues. It features the TMM Project's collective of talented artists, led by founder Terrance Michael Morgan and including female spoken word artist True Justice. Poetry, dance, and live music connect with the audience in a positive way to showcase how we can come together to be constructive instead of destructive in a creative way.

Born and raised in Louisiana, Terrance Micheal Morgan and the **TMM Project** (The True Mission Matters Project) are on a mission to improve the lives of today's youth by promoting positive youth development through the act of art, dance, speaking and more.



Louisiana Brass Quintet

The Louisiana Brass Quintet (*LBQ*) is the resident brass quintet of the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. LBQ provides dynamic and educational performances to students of all ages. Literature features original brass quintet compositions, baroque and classical transcriptions, and exciting jazz arrangements. Performers are dedicated to the education of students about the brass family and music – engaging audiences and including all in the music making.

The ensemble includes brass faculty members Paul Morton (trumpet), Catherine Roche-Wallace (horn), Benjamin Yates (trombone), and Joey Caponera (tuba). In fall 2024, the ensemble is joined by graduate student Max Volk (trumpet).



Keep Walking, the Horace Trahan Story

At the age of fifteen, Horace Trahan wanted to learn to play the accordion. His father brought him to Felix Richard, a strong accordionist and first cousin who lived in Cankton, LA. Horace was a natural and booked his first gig within six months of learning to play. Now a world-renowned Cajun and Zydeco artist, Horace Trahan and his band, the Ossun Express, have over-stepped boundaries and bypassed stereotypes, and brought his Louisiana music all over the world.

Learn about Horace's musical roots (starting at Ossun Elementary) and his journey through Cajun and Zydeco music in this fun and informative performance!




Say It With a Song - Building Language Skills Through Music
